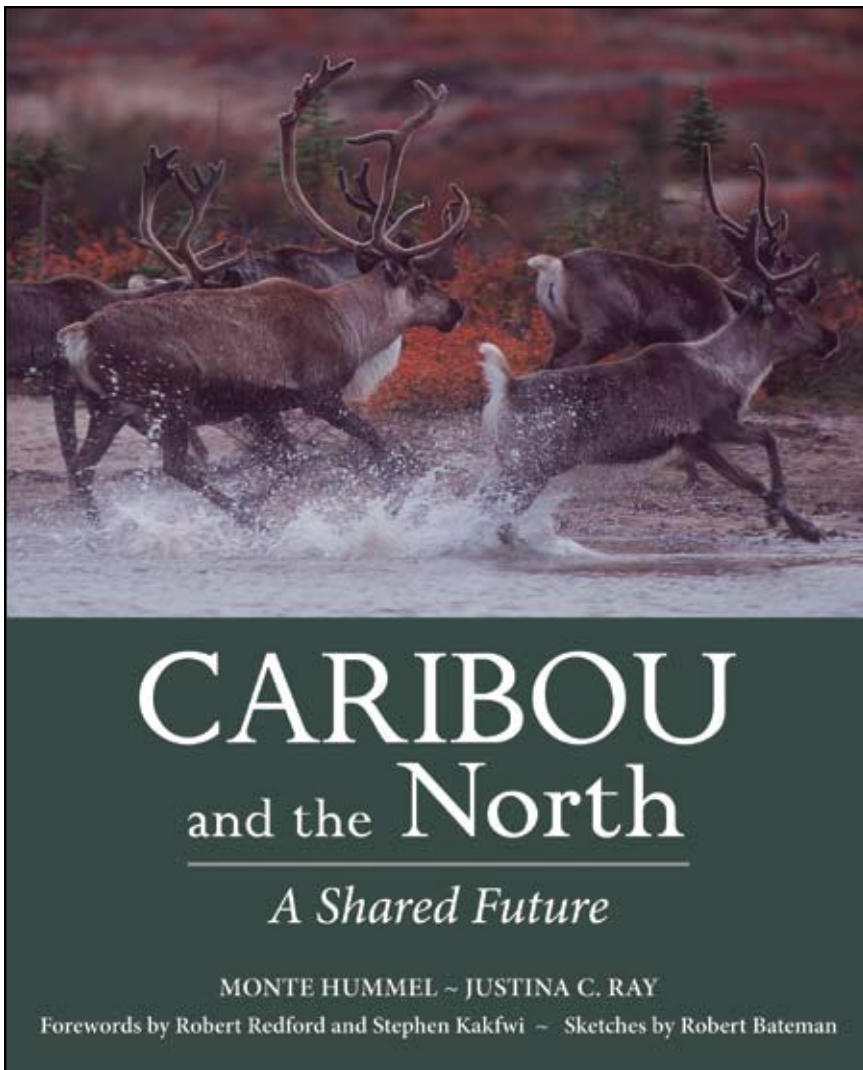

“So goes the North, so go the caribou.” But equally, “So go the caribou, so goes the North.” This is the message of *Caribou and the North: A Shared Future*, by Monte Hummel, President Emeritus of WWF Canada, and Dr. Justina C. Ray, Executive Director of Wildlife Conservation Society Canada.

Right now there is urgent, widespread concern about the future of the caribou. Laced with quotes and stories from northerners, scientists, and other conser-

vationists; sketches from Robert Bateman; maps; and more than 120 images from North America’s best wildlife photographers, *Caribou and the North* brings both the facts and the feelings of the current situation to a North American readership. The authors explore the reasons for the interlinked fate of caribou and the North, look at why we need to conserve the caribou, the threats that face caribou, and the actions we can take.

Caribou and the North also includes an appendix with up-to-date information on the range, movements, habitats, numbers, population trends, and key threats to caribou in North America.

Monte Hummel is President Emeritus of WWF-Canada. For thirty years he has led WWF’s work in the Arctic, especially through communities in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. He is the author/editor of five other conservation books.

Justina C. Ray is Executive Director of Wildlife Conservation Society and Adjunct Professor at the University of Toronto and Trent University. With a Ph.D. in wildlife ecology and conservation, her research efforts have spanned the globe from tropical forests to the taiga, with most of her recent work concentrated on wolverine and caribou in the boreal forests of Canada.
